



Corrugated Wire Glass

The greenhouse at the Brooklyn Museum fell into disrepair and was scheduled for demolition. The ceiling consisted of corrugated sheets of glass which were reinforced with steel wire. We salvaged numerous sheets of the corrugated glass in a variety of sizes.

Stanford White (1853-1906), designed the Brooklyn Museum and was considered to be The Gilded Age's most prominent architect. He designed houses for affluent clients and also embarked on many public and institutional buildings including the original design of The Brooklyn Museum.

Generally average sizes are 44"h × 28"w or 75"h × 28"w
